Texas Registered Agent Services



If you're a new business owner, you might not know the difference between your business address and your registered agent's address.

Every Texas business registered as a legal entity MUST have a Registered Agent (RA) on file with the state (must be a physical address & open during normal business hours).

A registered agent only receives official government documents that pertain to your business. The RA is not meant to receive regular mail or serve as a business address.

Helpful Tips When Completing New Entity Filings w/the State: In the Registered Agent Section, select the option: the Registered Agent is an "ORGANIZATION" and use the address listed above.

When to use your Registered Agent's (RA) Address for business purposes?

When to use your business address, P.O Box, or Virtual Office Address?

- Texas Comptroller's Office (ex. Franchise Tax or Sales Tax Notices)
- Texas Secretary of State (In business filings, use the RA address in the designated RA sections of LLC, PLLC, Non-Profit & applications).
- Legal notices from private & public agencies.
- Internal Revenue Service (IRS)
 (The RA cannot be used for the company's business address.
 However, it can be used as the mailing address, if needed).

- Banks and Financial Institutions (bank and credit card statements)
- Dun & Bradst Application process.
- Internal Revenue Service (IRS)
- Monthly bill statements for your company-related expenses. (ex. commercial Insurance, internet, and phone bills).
- Non-official mail, packages, inventory, products.

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
